

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT.

I, T. W. Phillis, being of full age and of sound and disposing mind and memory and not under any unlawful restraint, do make, publish and declare this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows.

Item 1. I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate as soon after my death as may be found convenient.

Item 2. All the real and personal property of my estate, both personal and real, and whosoever, I give, devise and bequeath to my wife, Vivian Phillis, to be hers for and during her natural lifetime. At my wife's death, I give, devise and bequeath, whatever may be left of my estate, both personal and real and whosoever found, to my five children, Clyde Phillis, Ethel Francis, Esther Garvin, Edna Clark, and Winnie Slater, share and share alike, to be theirs in fee simple. If any of my said children should not survive me, then his or her share is to go to his or her children.

Item 3. I hereby nominate and appoint my son, Clyde Phillis, and my daughter, Edna Clark, executors of this my last Will and Testament, and request that no bond be required of them as such executors by the Probate Court.

Item 4. I hereby revoke all other Wills by me, heretofore, made. In Witness Whereof, I hereunto subscribe my name to this my Last Will and Testament, this 19th day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-seven.
