MRS. EMILY JORDAN

Emily Stringer was born October 4th, 1842 in Noble County, Ohio and passed away at her home near Monteith, May 19, 1923, at the age of 81 years, 5 months and 5 days. On December 19th, 1861, she was married to F. M. Jordon and in February 1865, they came to Guthrie county and settled at the home where they lived happily together and to this union were born eight children, five boys and three girls all of whom are living and were with their mother when she passed away, save one daughter who died about twenty years ago. Mrs. Jordan was a noble woman, a devoted mother and a good neighbor. In the caring for her family she perhaps, bore a burden that but few could have endured, but she fought the fight, finished the course, and kept the faith. About 1876, she and husband united with the Baptist church. In 1894 they placed thier membership with the Church of Christ, at Monteith, and was faithful to the end. The funeral was held at the Monteith church, Sunday May 20th at 2:30 o'clock, conducted by her old friend and neighbor, H. T. Clampitt of Greenfield, to one of the largest gatherings ever assembled on a like occasion. Interment was made in the Monteith Cemetery.
